

FIRE SAFETY ADVISER

COMMITTED TO QUALITY TRAINING

The owner of a business or person that is occupying or managing a building in Queensland has a legal duty to ensure the safety of any person in that building in the event of a fire or other emergency. As part of the duty, in accordance with the Building Fire Safety Regulation (BFSR) 2008, there is a requirement for occupiers of high occupancy buildings, as defined under the BFSR 2008, to appoint and train a Fire Safety Adviser (FSA).

High occupancy buildings include:

- Class 2, 3, 5, 6, 7b, 8, 9a or 9b buildings that are workplaces where 30 or more workers are normally employed.
- Class 2 or 3 buildings that are more than 25 metres in height.
- Licensed premises that have been identified by the Commissioner as at risk of overcrowding.

Responsibilities of the FSA include:

- Be familiar with all aspects of building fire safety.
- Provide advice to the occupier to ensure that appropriate emergency planning has taken place.
- Provide advice to the occupier to ensure that appropriate instruction is carried out at the prescribed times and intervals.

Prerequisites: There are no formal academic prerequisite requirements for individual units of competency. To successfully complete the FSA course it is necessary that you have sound English literacy skills to read and comprehend information from a variety of sources and prepare documents such as:

- Fire and Evacuation (Management) Plans
- Fire Safety Checklists and Audit Tools
- Fire and Evacuation Sign and Diagrams incorporating evacuation procedures

Instructor: Fire 8 Qld facilitators are experienced fire safety professionals and have a high level of knowledge.

Assessment: FSA course involves extensive facilitator led assessment. Some post course assessment may be required for participants who do not complete all assessment activities during the given time.

Award Issued: Successful participants will receive a Statement of Attainment, with the following competencies:

- PUAWER001B - Identify, prevent and report potential workplace emergency situations.
- PUAWER002B - Ensure workplace emergency prevention procedures, systems and processes are implemented.
- PUAWER003B - Manage and monitor workplace emergency, procedures, equipment and other resources.
- PUAWER004B - Respond to workplace emergencies.
- PUAWER005B - Operate as part of an emergency control organisation.
- PUAWER006B - Lead an emergency control organisation.
- PUAWER007B - Manage an emergency control organisation.
- PUAWER008B - Confine small workplace emergencies.
